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Mobile Mammography Unit Comes to The Northside



On June 15, 2022, the Northside Voyagers Partnered with thee Bearden-Josey Center for Breast Health, a division of the Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System to provide mammograms for the residents of the Northside community. With transportation being a barrier to access for many, the Mobile Mammography Unit team agreed to bring the service to the people. The Dr. T.K. Gregg Community Center hosted the event for a full day of service. Although 1% of men get breast cancer annually, the focus was on the female population. Forty-seven patients were seen and successfully screened for breast cancer and in some cases, referrals were given to provide future treatments. This event was part of an on-going effort by The Northside Development Group and the Northside Voyagers to address the health needs of the community and the barriers to better health outcomes. Seniors Get Vouchers for Farmer Market



Since November of 2014 the Hub City Farmer's Market has worked diligently to provide fresh, local produce, meat, and dairy products on a weekly basis to Northside residents. In June of this year, the market held a three-day event to provide nutrition vouchers to senior residents of the greater Spartanburg community. Administered by the South Carolina Department of Social Services annually, the vouchers provide qualifying individuals with the opportunity to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at local authorized farmers' markets. Many seniors in the Northside and surrounding communities came out to participate and share their gratitude for the service. HCFM SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM COMPLETES THIRD YEAR



The Summer Youth Program has successfully completed its third year in existence at the Hub City Farmer's Market. Students 14-17 years of age were selected to participate in this year's cohort. Over the course of a two-month period during the summer, Youth Crew Members learned how to grow farm fresh foods at the Urban Farm while learning leadership, teamwork, and basic job skills. To participate, students are asked to have a teacher, coach, or mentor (non-family member) submit a letter of recommendation to the program director. Once selected. Crew members serve as advocates for their communities and are held to high standards of performance and behavior. Upon completion of the program, each participant receives a stipend. To date, 25 students have completed the Summer Youth Program and have shared their experiences with other students to inspire future participants. START:ME PITCH COMPETITION



Start:Me, a free fourteen week business training program modeled after Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia and adopted by The Northside Development Group, held it's first "pitch competition" in June of this year. This competition was created as part of a new program known as Build:Me. Build:Me was designed to serve as an enrichment program to further supplement the businesses of Start:Me graduates. Funding for the pitch competition was provided by the South Carolina Loan Fund, J.W.Woodward Funeral Home, The George Dean Johnson School of Business, and The Northside Development Group. Participants were given three minutes to give their "pitch" and local business owners/mentors chose the winners as follows: 1st place: Seed Thyme & Harvest-\$5000 (100% plant-based kitchen serving vegetarian and vegan delights), 2nd place: Mane Tame-\$2,500 (wig cleaning/maintenance service), 3rd place: **Beyond This February-\$1,500 (Bookstore featuring African American** authors), and 4th - 10th place receiving \$1,000 each. All funds were to be used for capital expenses by December of 2022. Applications for the 2023 cohort for Start:Me were accepted from September 15th - October 30th of this year. REDEVELOPMENT ANNOUNCEMENTS



• Oak & Avenue Property Group, a community development partner, closed on three of four new properties on Folsom St. in the month of September, with the homeowners slated to move in very soon. As a gesture of their commitment to helping families achieve homeownership, the four home plans were named after those families who purchased the homes. Future homeowners will have a choice of four names to choose from: The Dawkins, The Bomar, The Ballew, and The Lyles.

• Aden St. Warehouse, a re-development of 96k square feet of warehouse space with the goal of improving local amenities, supporting local employment, and cultivating space for residents to be successful in the Northside, is on schedule to receive necessary tax credits this fall. Located in the heart of the Northside community, this project will house such amenities as restaurants, office spaces, large outdoor greenspaces, and a variety of other economic opportunities. Rob Howell and The Avison Young Group is leading the effort to procure necessary funding for the project which is slated for completion in the 4th quarter of 2023.

• Creekside Village, a mixed-income housing development including 31 units of townhomes, brownstones, and single-family homes, is currently under construction with the laying of its first foundations in September of 2022. Rick Quinn, a developer out of Greenville, S.C. anticipates completion of this project in late Spring off 2023.

Along with these developments, NDG has several individuals in their "pipeline to homeownership" that are at various stages of the process and will be featured in our "Transformation Tuesday's" series that highlights new homeowners in the community.
